In the fall Sandra Schlegel was elected president. Miss Erma Bayer sponsors the local chapter.

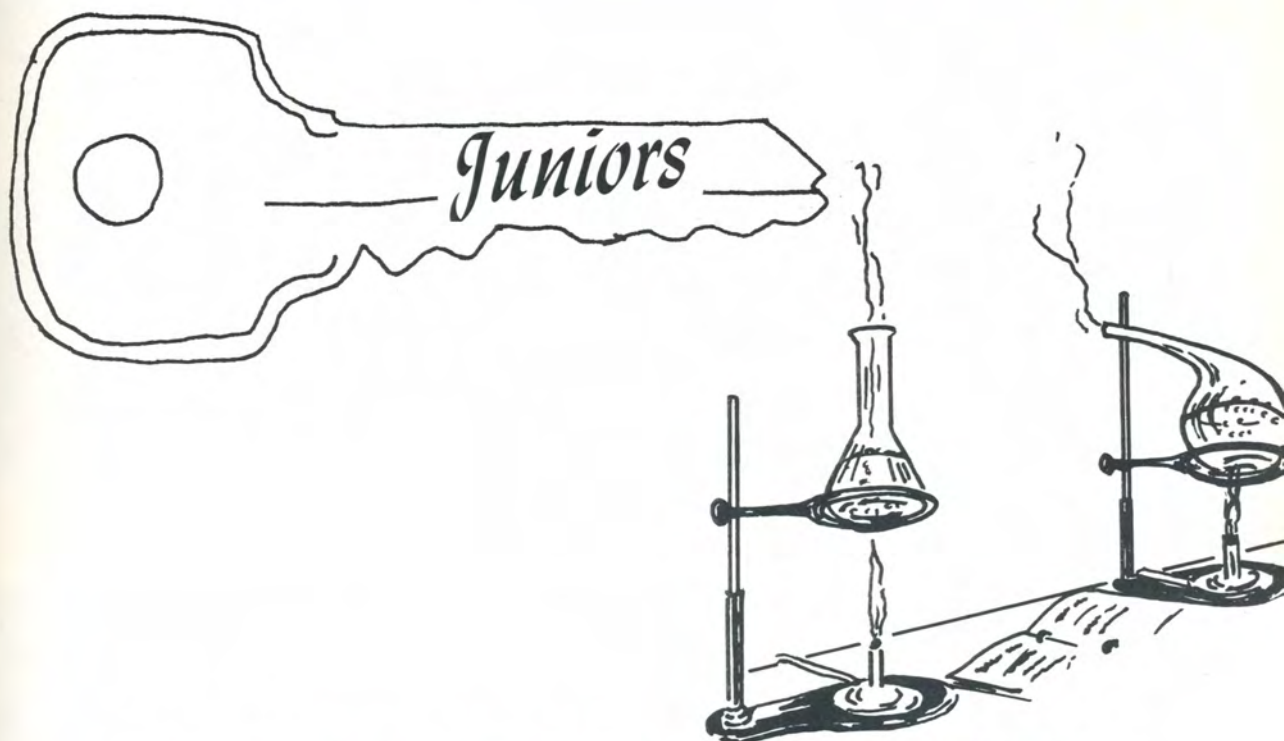

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

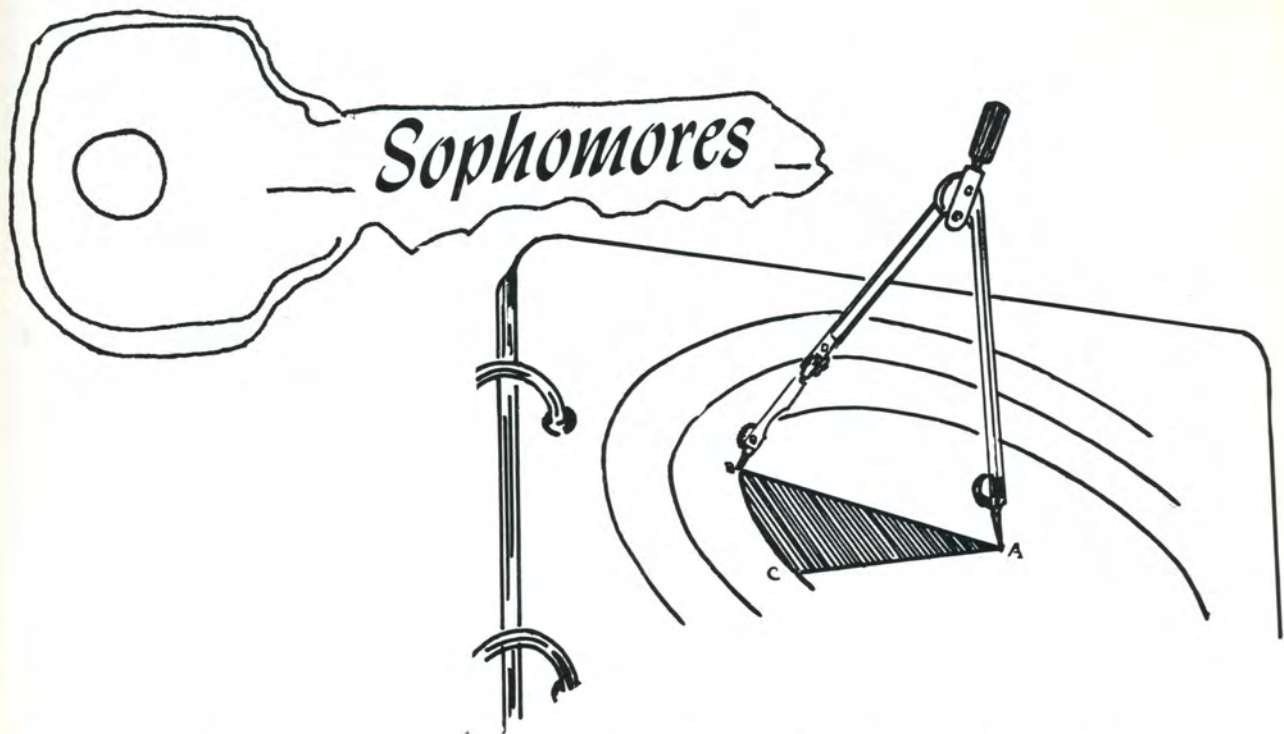
We christened the new gym in October with a dance to begin our fund-raising projects. The February dance, "with a valentine theme, was also sponsored by the Juniors.

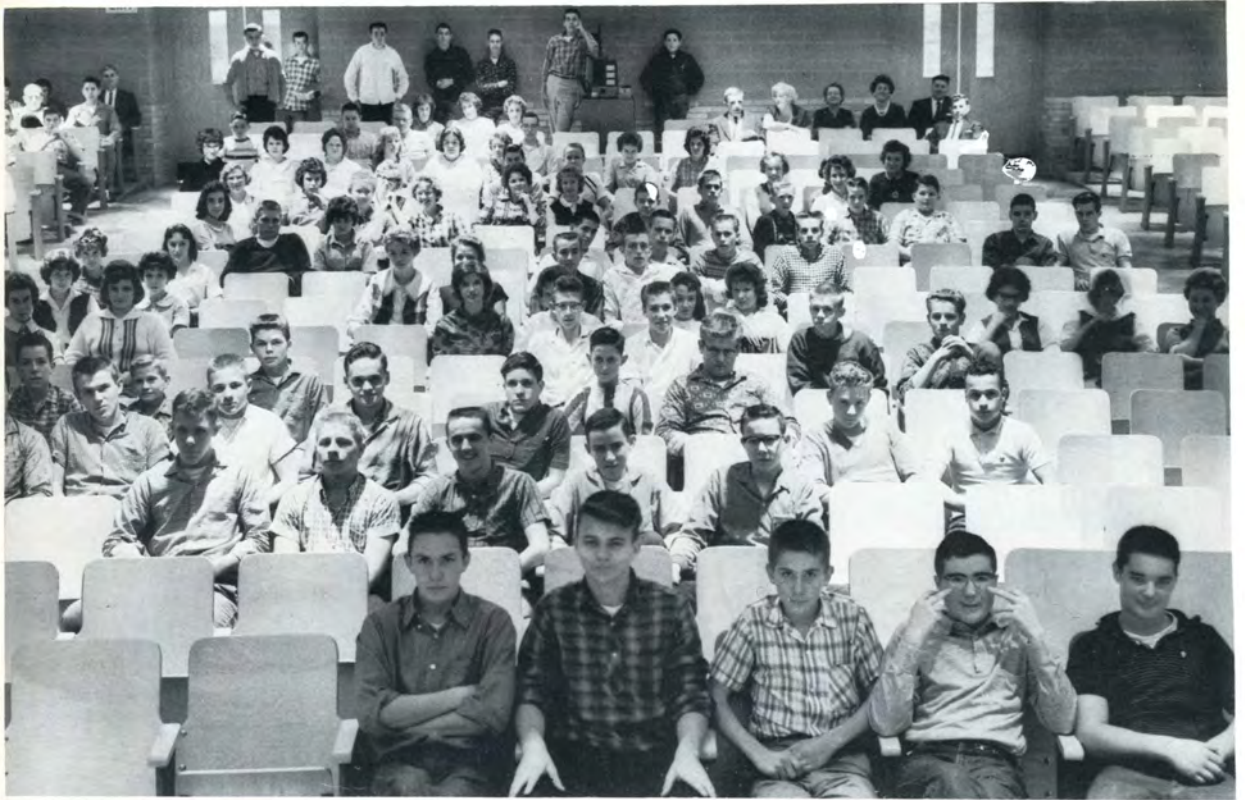

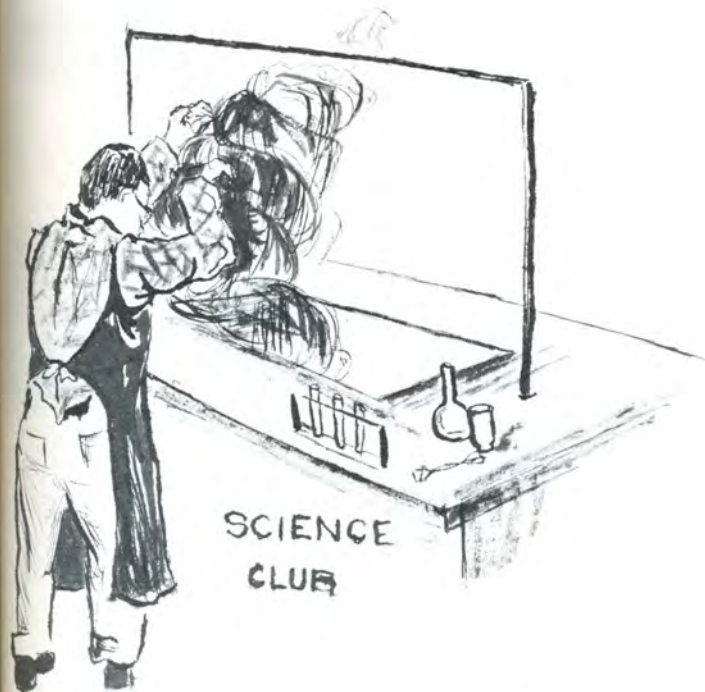

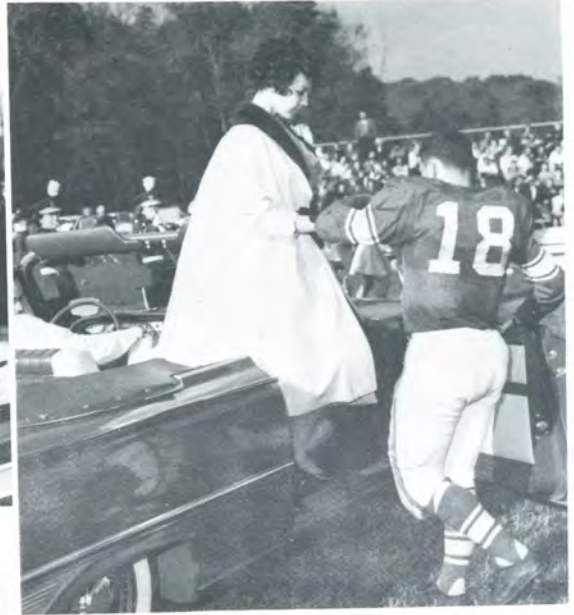

Have you ever wondered who the friendly people are that work in the bookstore each morning and noon? They are members of your own Student Council.

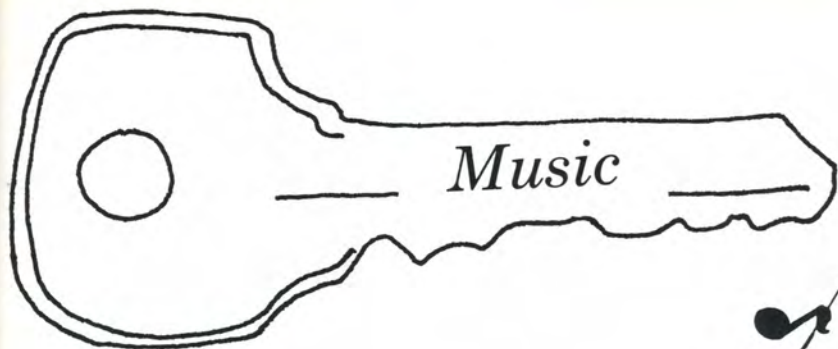

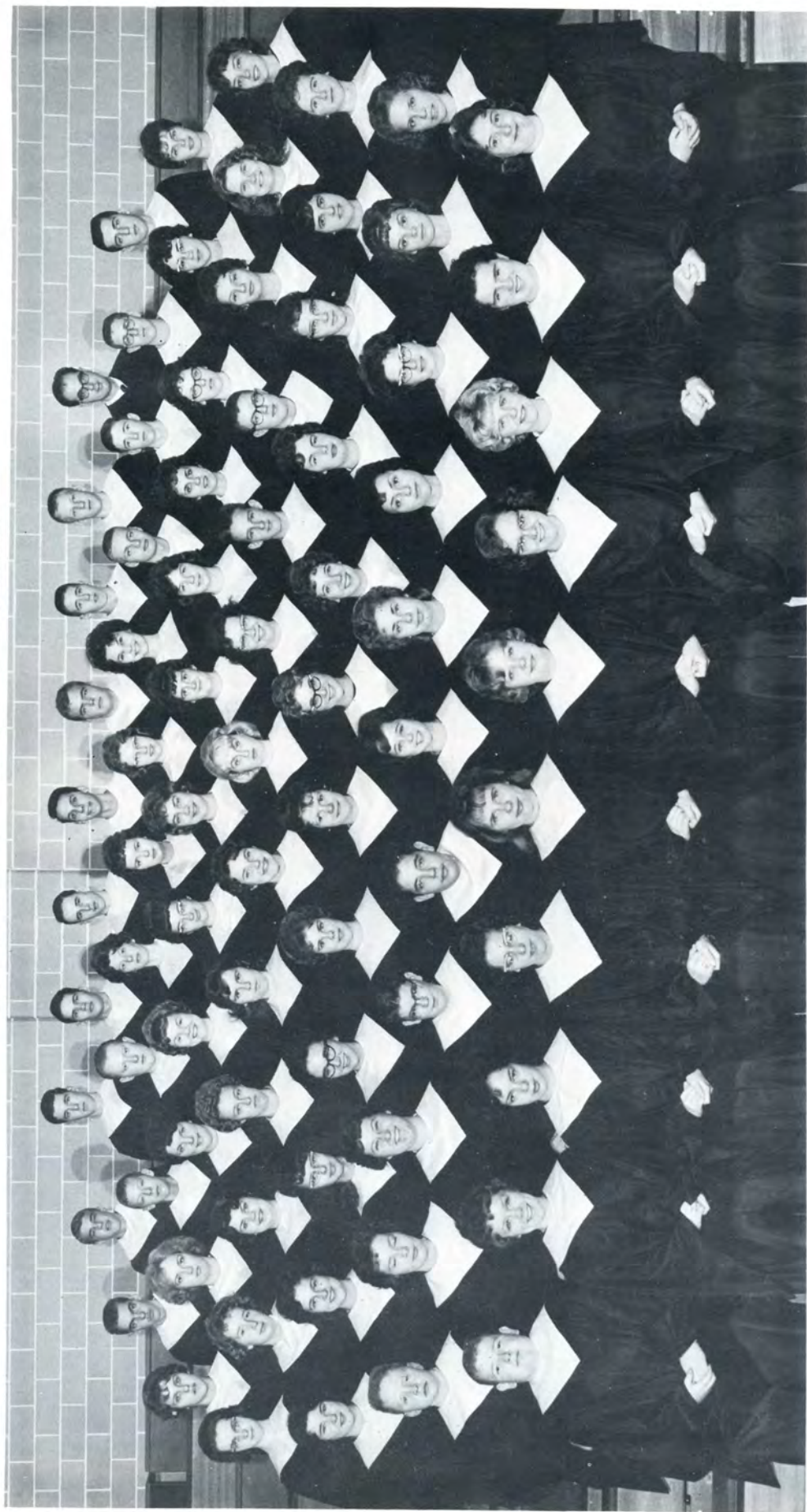

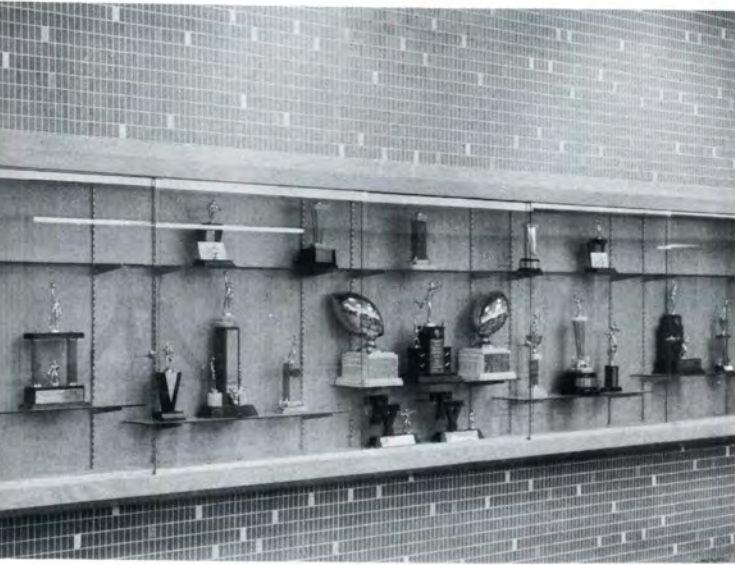

The chorus shared the responsibility of the Christmas candy sale and performed at the Christmas and spring concerts.

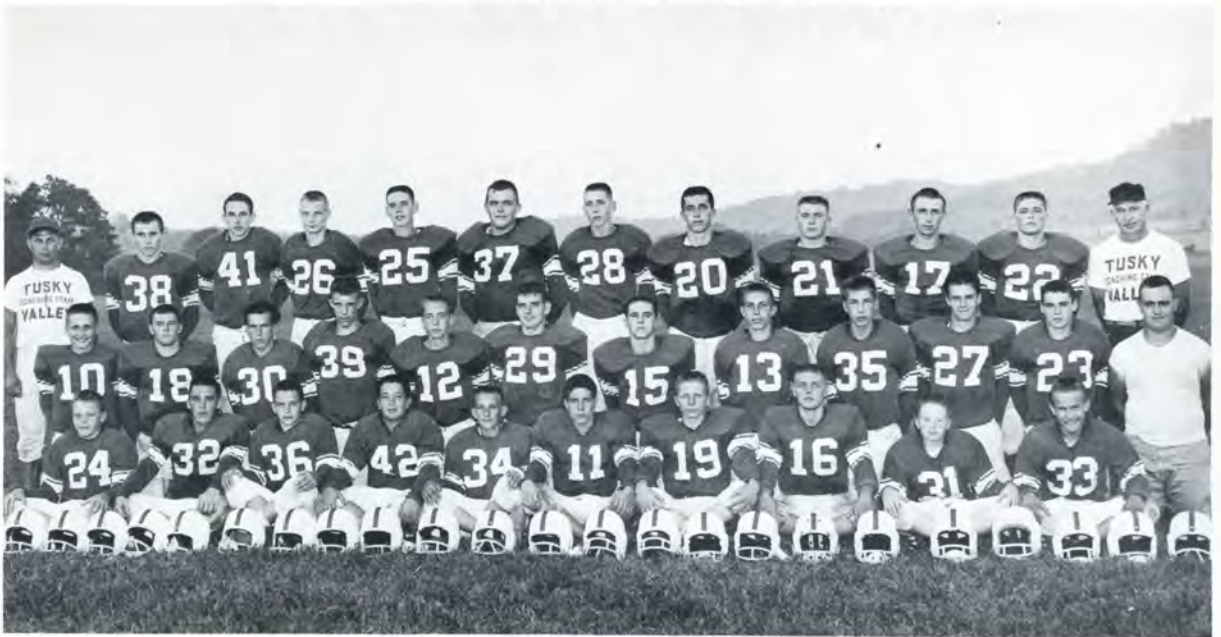

SEASON'S RECORD

Dennison defeated the Trojans 28-8 with Crilley scoring. T.B. dampened the homecoming of arch-rival, Strasburg, 22-6, with T.D. 's by Nemetz (2) and Widder. T. V. A. C. Champions, Malvern, defeated the Trojans 40-6 with Crilley scoring the lone T.D. Following was a 12-0 shut-out loss to West Lafayette. Sandy Valley defeated Tusky Valley 8-6 in the season's finale.
